#### **ITEM 1. Proposed Project**

The Madera County Sheriff's Office enforces OHMV laws throughout the County which consists of approximately 2,147 square miles. The Sheriff's Office patrols forest service lands, private properties, riverbeds, riparian areas, agricultural lands, and railroad rights-of-way. Some areas are precluded from patrol, such as State prison sites and the Ansel Adams Wilderness.

This year we seek funding for Deputy and Reserve o/t hours, 2 Jeep Rubicons, 2 sets of tracks for our ATV/UTV's, upgrades for DRZ400's, lap top computers, handheld/In Reach GPS units, maintenance of equipment, and miscellaneous safety equipment/supplies.

The Sheriff seeks to purchase 2 Jeep Rubicon's. The County accommodates riders from all over the State. Our OHV riding areas are comprised of remote, rugged trails and roads, & areas that cannot be accessed by a standard 4 wheel drive. A Jeep Rubicon is built to safely navigate these roadways and trails. It would allow the sheriff's office to effectively patrol these areas & respond to emergencies, transport personnel, equipment, and lost or injured individuals.

A vast amount of acreage in Madera County is extremely remote and does not have cell service. While on patrol, it is not uncommon for deputies to come into contact with other outdoor enthusiasts that are in need of assistance. This vehicle would be able to safely navigate the remote areas and allow Deputies to safely patrol the riding areas, and educate riders. Currently, the Sheriff's Office does not possess a vehicle that is capable of responding to remote areas in without having to hook up a trailer & travel to another location to pick up the ATV/UTV which can take up to an hour. The Jeep Rubicon could respond directly to location, drastically minimizing the response time.

The Sheriff's Office is requesting 2 in order to deploy both vehicles simultaneously. This allows Deputies to work together and/ or have the ability to search multiple areas at one time. This price of the Jeep includes aftermarket equipment. This equipment will assist with Deputy safety and allow for more efficient emergency calls.

The Sheriff also seeks to purchase tracks, one set each for the UTV and ATV. We have found that the tracked machines require less training and experience than a snowmobile. The tracked UTV's can carry more equipment and personnel, can rescue, and recover snowmobiles, if necessary, while enclosed and out of the elements.

He also wishes to purchase hand-held & In-reach GPS units. The hand helds will assist with noting the location of violations, and locating missing riders or deputies. The In-reach units have live tracking and an SOS option. Should the rider lose radio contact with other deputies, they can be easily located. These units will also allow the deputies to set way points and send messages to others while on patrol.

Our DRZ400 motorcycles need upgrades in order to be useful for our OHV needs. They include, suspension, black plastics and fuel tanks. The black plastics are damaged and worn from years of riding. The stock suspension has a weight limit that does not accommodate a rider and his gear. Upgraded tanks will allow our riders to have double the patrol time in the high country where there are no means to re-fuel.

The Sheriff is requesting lap top computers to assist deputies in the field. This will allow Deputies to view maps and track stats while patrolling and will also assist Deputies with patrol area planning and injuried rider rescue management. He would also like funding for helmets, vests, gloves, boots, snow shoes, and misc safety equipment. We are also looking to upgrade lights and sirens on our OHV equipment to maintain usefulness of these vehicles for years to come.

OHV opportunities in Madera County draw enthusiasts from throughout the region, including the Fresno Metropolitan Area which is immediately adjacent to the county-line. Funding restriction limits the County's ability to properly serve this external population. OHV Registration fees for such vehicles return to their County of residence.

The Sheriff's Office has mutual agreements with Federal and State law enforcement and resource

conservation officers. Coordinated patrols with Federal and State agents are routine. The County is unable to fund over-time hours required to perform such duties. Funding for over-time hours, will also augment the Sheriff's capacity to meet its legal obligation for search-and-rescue. OHV violations of private property is damaging to agricultural production. Farmers seek greater enforcement of property protection and have met signage obligations. Protection of this industry is an enforcement priority. Coordinated services with the Madera Irrigation District were established to minimize damage to water delivery systems. The OHV program provides educational outreach at Fairs, Parades, and School. The Sheriff's Office maintains an OHV website, linked to State Parks, at http://www.madera-county.com/sheriff/ohv/index.html.

## ITEM 2. Project Coverage

The Madera County Sheriff's Department patrols approximately 2,143 square miles. All of our officers are fully empowered to enforce OHMV laws throughout the County of Madera, including federal lands.

The areas patrolled consist of forest service lands, private properties, riverbeds, riparian areas, agricultural lands, rural areas and railroad rights-of-way. As stated previously, some areas are precluded from patrol, such as State prison sites and the Ansel Adams Wilderness.

#### ITEM 3. Describe the frequency of the patrols

The Madera County Sheriff's Department's patrols daily. The Department has 77 sworn deputies that are fully empowered to enforce OHV laws throughout Madera County. The County undertakes special enforcement patrols twice a month. These patrols are two man teams patrolling six to eight hours. This level of effort is representative of the past several years. We are looking to increase patrols and ride time through this year's grant funding by adding Deputies and Deputy Reserves to our team.

Given budget constraints on locally funded over-time, the Department has not rescinded targeted OHV enforcement teams. Without OHMV funding, the Department will not provide any targeted OHV enforcement services in FY 2017-18. OHMV funding is critical in the coming year to continue our safety, education, and enforcement program.

#### **ITEM 4. Deployment of Personnel**

We currently have ten part-time Deputy Sheriff's assigned to OHV patrol with the two part-time deputies that were added with last year's funding. We have initiated a more vigorous Reserve Deputy Sheriff component to this program. The are augmented by the balance of the Deputies of the Madera County Sheriff's Department who are fully-empowered to enforce all OHMV laws throughout the County of Madera.

We provide high priority law enforcement to the forest service, agricultural lands, river bottoms riparian areas, railroad rights-of-way, rural areas and private property. We assist private property owners in trespass prevention and signage requirements.

2. Describe how the proposed Project relates to OHV Recreation and will sustain OHV Recreation, motorized offhighway access to non-motorized recreation, or OHV Opportunities associated with the Project Area:

Our deputies provide safety and education programs to the public and enforce violations of OHV operating laws. We also provide a positive and safe environment for legal riders. The Department continues to have an annual display of our OHV equipment, literature and contact information at each of two County fairs. The OHV unit also rides annually in several Madera County community parades.

3. Describe the Applicant's formal or informal cooperation with other law enforcement agencies:

Madera Sheriff's Deputies cooperate and coordinate patrols with all law enforcement agencies in this region, including but not limited to, CHP, Fish and Game, US Forest Service, City of Madera PD, Fresno PD and City of Chowchilla PD. The efforts are supported by years of mutual aid and enforcement activity. Many patrols each year are composed of multi-jurisdictional officers. Patrol frequency and location Information is shared between city and county law enforcement where there is shared jurisdiction (river bottom patrols).

The department personnel has, in the past, attended specialized courses in OHV operations and resource conservation, including but not limited to: 40 hours of on and off-highway vehicle training in San Bernadino, Fresno or Alameda County; 80 hours of POST motorcycle school training; and 32 hours of Rich Oliver motorcycle training. Department personnel also attend forest service policy meetings regularly. The Madera County Sheriff works closely with the Us Forest Service and is briefed yearly by the USFS on the USFS motorized management system as to the proper use of roadways, trails and sensitive and archaeological sites. We also work very closely with the stewards of the sierra nonprofit organization, which receives OHV grant funds to maintain the trails and roadways in the Sierra national forest, within Madera county. The Sheriff will continue OHV specialized training courses for the team if our training budget permits.

The Department and the US Forest Service have established agreements that authorize Deputy Sheriff's to enforce laws on federal lands.
